- Enrolls income-eligible US citizens in prescription drug company patient assistance programs, and completes all necessary forms involving client, physician, and pharmaceutical company
- Charges \$25 per prescription per month; fee includes paperwork
- Initial enrollment takes 4 weeks, and then refills are automatically mailed out every 3 months.
- Income eligibility: Single \$20,800 or less per year, Couple \$31,000 or less per year
- Cannot have prescription insurance coverage by may have health insurance, Medicaid or an HMO. May have a discount prescription drug card and still qualify.

The American Optometric Association recommends having an eye exam every year and a comprehensive eye exam every 2-5 years for patients ages 18-60 and an annual evaluation for patients age 61 and older. Patients at risk, and this including having diabetes, should be examined at least every year regardless of age.
